A Word of Welcome

We are glad you are our guest today. We welcome everyone participate in this Mass – and the other activities and ministries of this congregation – we ask that only those in full communion with the Catholic Church receive Holy Communion, an expression not of exclusion, but of the fervent hope that all Christians may one day be authentically reunited, fulfilling our Lord’s prayer “that they all may be one.”

The custom at this Mass will be to receive kneeling. If you need to stand, you are welcome to do so. Even if you are not receiving the Holy Communion, please come forward with the other worshipers, and cross your arms across your chest and bow your head as a sign that you wish to receive a prayer of blessing from the Priest instead.

Nearly 5 million people are fleeing for their lives to neighboring countries—leaving behind homes, jobs and everything familiar.
