A Word of Welcome

We are glad you are our guest today. We welcome everyone participate in this Mass – and the other activities and ministries of this congregation – we ask that only those in full communion with the Catholic Church receive Holy Communion, an expression not of exclusion, but of the fervent hope that all Christians may one day be authentically reunited, fulfilling our Lord's prayer "that they all may be one."

The custom at this Mass will be to receive kneeling. If you need to stand, you are welcome to do so. Even if you are not receiving the Holy Communion, please come forward with the other worshipers, and cross your arms across your chest and bow your head as a sign that you wish to receive a prayer of blessing from the Priest instead.

If, for what ever reason, you cannot receive the Blessed Sacrament at this Mass, please feel free to pray an act of Spiritual Communion like this one:

In union, dear Lord, with all the faithful at every altar of thy Church where the blessed Body and Blood are being offered to the Father, I desire to offer thee praise and thanksgiving. I believe thou art truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament. And since I cannot now receive thee sacramentally, I beseech thee to come spiritually into my heart. I unite myself unto thee, and embrace thee with all the affections of my soul. Let me never be separated from thee. Let me live and die in thy love. Amen.
